
# Wyoming State Muzzleloader Association's News April, 2018

- Historian: Lyle Lyle resigned as historian. Bill made suggestions on who we could get to fill the position with, he will work on it.
- Web Site: Bill Bill thinks everything is going ok, but he needs new pictures.

#### • Old Business:

- Club insurance was brought up again and Trish said she would give Bruce contact information for Jerry Ackley and Lockton Insurance.
- Sandy asked if the seating that was allowed for cross-sticks was for every cross-sticks match, it was answered that yes it was for every cross-sticks match.
- It was asked if they could use a recoil pad, it was determined that they could as long as there were no peep sites.
- Trish brought up that rulebooks were ordered for DCML and suggested other clubs order them as well so they all know the rules.
- Bill brought up that the Wyoming 4 H foundation asked for a donation. It was brought up that we said we would not be giving any donations this year.
- The Parkway Plaza sent a letter asking us to hold our annual meeting there again. Everyone agreed that we are happy with Ramkota and have signed a contract with them.

#### • New Business:

- Magic asked if we've had to tap into a CD before it was due and Crystal said we did last year. Magic asked if we could have a rotation on CDs that come due every 6 months. Melissa noted that they were put in how they were now to receive better returns. Crystal said the next one that will come due is in August 30-2017. Melissa suggested we shop around for CDs that might have better interest rates. Crystal said she would shop around.
- Bill's club has two gun builders so he thought they could build guns for the club to raffle but it wouldn't be donated. We discussed pros and cons of raffles and buying things to raffle versus receiving donations to raffle. Melissa said we would have to sell items outside of the group and sell items that people outside of the group would be interested in. Magic suggested we have a meeting Friday night at convention to get people together to discuss fundraising ideas. Sandy suggested we do silent auction items next year at convention. Bill tasked the group to think about ideas to make more money.

#### Minutes:

- o Katie read the minutes from the State Shoot in June of 2017.
- o Sandy made a correction to the minutes stating she had been present.
- Melissa made a motion to accept the meeting minutes as corrected,

#### • Treasure's Report:

- o Crystal read the treasure's report.
- o Insurance options were discussed. Lockton Insurance was too expensive for the State so the state went with Laramie Investments for \$1,081.34 for one year of insurance.
- o Traveling Trophy funds were discussed.
- Magic made a motion to accept the treasure's report. Trish seconded the motion; it was voted upon and passed.

#### Committee Reports:

- Convention Trish:
  - 29 Traders are registered for this year's convention. 3 more would have been present but had to cancel for health reasons.
  - Dinner will be at 5 pm Saturday, January 6, 2018. The charge will be \$23 per person (12 and under are free).
  - 3 seminars will be offered on Saturday, January 6th.
  - Advertisement for this convention was in newspapers, on the radio, TV, and Facebook.

- The general meeting will be held at 1 p.m. on Saturday, January 6<sup>th</sup> in the Wyoming Theater Room at the Ramkota. A microphone will be available.
- Prizes will be given out during the general meeting.
- The convention contract is set for January of 2019.
- o Entertainment Paula:
  - Swing sounds is ready to go for Saturday, January 6th.
- o Auction Ed:
  - This year Ed will have bid sheets available for people to bid on auction items before the live auction begins. Those bid sheets will then be used to start the live auction bidding.
  - Ed also would like to ensure that every bidder has a number before the auction begins to avoid confusion and help the process go faster.
  - He can always use more volunteers such as spotters.
- Photo Contest Magic:
  - Magic said next year there will be a 3 year old restriction on pictures entered into the contest. Pictures entered must have been taken within the last 3 years. Everyone agreed this was a good idea.
- Newsletter Sandy:
  - Sandy will be collecting flyers to ensure she has current/upcoming shoot information to include in the next newsletter.
  - The main issue Sandy is facing is the fact that people send her information in all different programs/formats. It was suggested that she request everything be sent to her in PDF format
- o Hats and T-Shirts Paula:
  - There is a new company out of Glenrock that is doing the printing of our shirts now. She said so far they are fast and good to work with and it helps us support a local business.
  - Discussion ensued on prices for merchandise. It was brought up that we had decided last year to add just \$5 to the cost of the merchandise so the club could make some profit while still providing affordable merchandise.
- o Traveling Trophy and State Trophies Melissa:
  - Awards can be confusing because State Awards go from Convention to Convention, whereas the Traveling Trophy goes from State Shoot to State Shoot. In order to circumvent confusion Melissa proposed a procedural change be implemented for the Traveling Trophy. Melissa created a form for each club to use when they have a Traveling Trophy shoot.

#### January 5, 2018

Clubs will fill out this form and send the form with the qualifier/winners name, and the money from the Traveling Trophy targets, to Crystal. Crystal moved to accept this procedural change. Paula seconded the motion; it was voted upon and passed.

- Crystal asked for clarification on the cost of the Traveling Trophy target. Clubs may set their own price for the Traveling Trophy target but \$1 of that must be sent in to the State.
- Discussion ensued about the cost of awards.
- o Historian Vacant:
  - It was discussed that we need to get the information that was collected and find someone to fill this position.
- Website Bill:
  - The website is not very user friendly but he's working with it.

#### Old Business:

- o Insurance:
  - This discussion was covered when the treasure's report was read. Our insurance is valid from December 20, 2017 to December 20, 2018.
- Hotel Issues:
  - The hotel issue has been solved. Our date was changed but room rates were dropped to compensate for this. Trish has already worked with the hotel for the 2019 convention.
- o Increasing Income/Participation:
  - It was discussed that State Membership and participation was down from previous years. While this seems to be a national issue as well it was discussed what could be done at a local level. Suggestions included increasing recruitment and outreach efforts both internally with our own club members as well as externally with other groups. It was noted in the meantime that the State should be very fiscally minded until income/participation increases.
  - Bill spoke with gun builders about making guns to raffle for a fundraiser. However, parts alone would be around \$750 and would require people to commit to sell raffle tickets.
- Magic made a motion to adjourn, Paula seconded the motion; we adjourned at 8:49 p.m.





# 7th Annual Wild's of Wyoming Muzzleloader Skeet and Trap Shoot April 27-29, 2018





Guns allowed: Any front stuff gun, shotgun, trade gun, smoothbore, flint, percussion.

Where: Worland, Wyoming, Shooting Complex

3 miles Northwest of Worland on County Rd 15 mile Signs will be posted.

When: April 27-29, 2018. Range will be open at 9:00 am to 5:00 pm on Friday and Saturday. Sunday range will open from 9:00 till noon for shoot offs and awards.

Cost: Entry fees \$20.00 plus \$3.00 per match shot.

If you do not have a smoothbore or shotgun, show up, someone will have one for you to shoot and try out. Powder, shot and caps will be available. We will accept donations to help cover the cost of the powder, shot and caps. This is a family event; we want to encourage more women and youth to participate.

Currently there are 20 scheduled matches. Women: Skeet and Trap, Men's: Skeet and Trap; and Youth; Skeet and Trap. Additional matches for Flintlock and traditional shotguns will be offered. All but one match will be re-entry. You can shoot as many matches as you want. Cost is \$3.00 per round.

**Trap Rounds**: shoot 10-16 birds per match from 10-16 yards.
